Building Our Healthcare Model

- Two clinical sites as of 2024 with 500-patient capacity
- Ongoing piloting and cohort study
- Designing 40,000 sf liberated space for community healing (the Center) for 8,000-12,000 primary care patients
- Opening in 2027, the Center will be located on S. Trenton Street in Seattle, at Rainier Beach light rail
- Parallel development with Mt. Baker Housing, which is building a 170-unit complex with affordable family homes next to health center



Medicine for the People: A Care Model Grounded in Individual & Community Power



Whole-person, integrative care combining western and traditional medicine provided by care teams from our communities, addressing body, mind, and spirit.



Gets at root causes. From treatment plans to policy advocacy, our care model accounts for the systems that make us unwell.



Concierge care support across your healthcare journey, including assistance with your treatment plan, help with health-related social needs, and accompaniment in outside appointments.



Our own research and data. Community-directed research to test and refine community solutions for our health, using community-identified measures of success.
